


W.A.V.E. 2022, "A Day on the Bay" Overview Pensacola Bay August 27, 2022

In 2012, Navy Yacht Club Pensacola (NYCP) Commodore Kathy Champagne proposed the idea of creating an opportunity to thank disabled veterans who sustained physical and psychological wounds for their service and sacrifice. Knowing how to thank all the military veterans who risked life and limb in service of our country was a difficult challenge. However, the idea of a free day of sailing, barbecue, music and tokens of appreciation was not a bad place to start so The Wounded American Veterans

Event (WAVE) was instituted. W.A.V.E. became a private, all volunteer initiative organized in the beginning by the Pensacola Bay Area Yacht Clubs including NYCP, Pensacola Yacht Club (PYC), Pensacola Beach Yacht Club (PBYC), Fort Walton Yacht Club (FWYC), Eglin Yacht Club (EYC) and The Point Yacht Club (PtYC). W.A.V.E 2012 became the first of what has become an annual event on Pensacola Bay.



It features a sail on private boats for wounded and disabled veterans and an adult guest of their choice. The afternoon's activities include an opening ceremony with color guard, live entertainment, guest speakers such as RADM Garvin, Commander, NETC, Naval Air Station Pensacola, and a complimentary lunch and beverages. Veterans are presented with a commemorative gift.

This year, WAVE had 16 local boat owners offering their boats to take the wounded and disabled veterans for a cruise on Pensacola Bay. Several photos are provided to underscore the success of the WAVE. Each boat is given a WAVE Burgee to honor their participation and commitment to the WAVE. In addition to the boat owners, several volunteers were involved with the event including the American Legion Post 240 cooking/grilling team; six Civil Air Patrol Cadets, over 50 young Naval Officers and Enlisted and Marine Officer and Enlisted Personnel from NATTC and MATSG-21. NATTC also provided a trio of singers who sang the National Anthem and the Color Guard who posted the Colors for the event. Without these ACTIVE DUTY VOLUNTEERS the event could not have been a success.




